These organic heirloom tomato seeds produce a vigorous, regular leaf, tomato plant that yields large (1-2 lb.) dark pink fruit with lots of tomato flavors. These organic tomato seeds produce big, regular leaf plants that produce above average amounts of beautiful light-orange, irregular shaped (fluted) heirloom tomatoes that can grow to 2 pounds or more, with an average diameter of 5 inches. Excellent sweet, almost tropical fruit flavors	
Beefsteak	<b>Big Beef</b>	Days: 70 Size: Indeterminate Color: Red Season: Mid-Season Type: Open Pollinated	This is a de-hybridized version of an American favorite. These large, juicy, fruits combine old-fashioned beefsteak flavor with heavy yields. 1-pound, round to globe-shaped. Flavor is full and hearty with lots of sweet juice balanced with that wonderful tomato acidity. These giants slice up perfectly for big sandwiches. Fruit stays large even at the end of a long harvest season.	
Beefsteak	<b>Black Krim-Heirloom</b>	Days: 75 Size: Indeterminate Color: Purple-Black Season: Mid-Season Type: Heirloom Beefsteak	Originally from the Isle of Krim on the Black Sea in the former Soviet Union. This rare, and outstanding tomato yields 3-4" slightly flattened dark-red (mahogany-colored) slightly maroon, beefsteak tomatoes with deep green shoulders. Green gel around seeds. Fantastic, intense, slightly salty taste (which is great for those not wanting to add salt to their tomatoes). One of my best black tomatoes. Also suitable for container/patio garden. Perfect choice for slicing, salads and cooking.

A very popular variety for shorter growing regions. Great for growing in containers.

The fruits have dense, creamy, sweet flesh with luscious, full tomato flavor that features a good balance of acidity and sweetness. Vigorous vines are very productive, which is special for a potato-leaved plant.	
Beefsteak	<b>Marvel Stripe-Heirloom</b>	Days: 95 Size: Indeterminate Color: Bi-Colored Season: Late-Season Type: Heirloom Beefsteak	Beefsteak originally from Oaxaca, Mexico. Largest of the bi-colored tomatoes. May get over 4-inches and 2 pounds. Sweet, mild fruity flavors.







Beefsteak	<b>Paul Robeson-Heirloom</b>	Days: 74 Size: Indeterminate Color: Purple-Black Season: Mid-Season Type: Heirloom Beefsteak	<p>Tomato seeds for this Russian heirloom were made available by Marina Danilenko, a Moscow seeds woman. This favorite heirloom tomato was named after the operatic artist who won acclaim as an advocate of equal rights for Blacks. His artistry was admired world-wide, especially in the Soviet Union. This "black" beefsteak tomato is slightly flattened, round, and grows to 4-inches. Its deep, rich colors stand it apart from others. It has dusky, dark-red, with dark-green shoulders, and red flesh in its center. Very flavorful fruits with luscious, earthy, exotic flavors and good acid/sweet balance. Paul Robeson (aka Pol Robeson) won "Best of Show" at Carmel TomatoFest.</p> <p>As this tomato variety originates from Siberia and sets fruits at lower temps, it is an excellent choice for cooler growing regions.</p>	
Beefsteak	<b>Pineapple-Heirloom</b>	Days: 85 Size: Indeterminate Color: Bi-Colored Season: Late-Season Type: Heirloom Beefsteak	<p>An heirloom garden favorite that grows to 2 lbs. This bi-colored, slightly flattened, yellow beefsteak has a red blushing and streaks on the outside. It's yellow interior contains few seeds and a red star-burst in the center. Taste is wonderfully mild with tropical fruity-sweet flavors. This is a show stopper!</p>

Fruits are irresistibly delicious with sweet, rich, complex, full tomato flavors that burst in your mouth, characteristic of the best flavorful black tomatoes. Bell Pepper	Gourmet	Gourmet is one of the best orange peppers we've seen. This Swiss variety matures early enough to get good color before frost. It has heavy, thick walls, the traditional blocky shape, and the sweetest flavor you'll find in an orange pepper. Typically produces 6-12, 4-lobed fruit per plant. Bell-shaped fruit are 3 inches wide and 5 inches long. TMV.	
Bell Pepper	Sweet Chocolate	Rich chocolate-brown bell pepper.  Remarkable earliness, tolerance of cool nights, and a heavy set. Bell Pepper	Golden Star Star	62 days. Golden Star is sure to shine in your garden. The picture-perfect fruit is very thick walled and grows to a blocky, 4 inch size. Young peppers start out a shiny, medium-green then mature to a gorgeous, bright yellow. The crisp, sweet flavor makes this pepper perfect for fresh snacking. But don't neglect the frying pan, these peppers are wonderful for cooking, too.	
Bell Peppers	California Wonder	65 days. Each plant produces wonderfully sweet bell peppers that are typically 4 lobed, thick-walled, and blocky.
